



Mr. Nathaniel "Cookie" Brown

February 27, 1937 - June 1, 2021

SAVANNAH - Mr. Nathaniel Robert Brown "Cookie" 84, entered eternal rest on Tuesday, June 1, 2021 at Riverview Health & Rehabilitation Center. He was a native of Savannah, Georgia, was the son of the late Julia Brown and Henry Frazier. His early education was obtained at Penn Elementary School in Beaufort, South Carolina. He then transferred to West Savannah Elementary School, the former Moses Jackson. He attended Second Saint John Missionary Baptist Church with his mother and was baptized at the age of 12 by the late Reverend J. J. Dinkins. He was a very dedicated and committed member of Second Saint John Missionary Baptist Church, serving on many ministries including Chairman of the Trustee Ministry, Coordinator of the Men's Ministry and Men's Day Program, Sunday School, Male Chorus, Adult Choir and attended Bible Study.

Brother Brown graduated from Woodville High School in 1957. He played football, but excelled in Track. He ran in the 4x400 relay and 100-yard dash. Nathaniel was a great athlete and traveled to many places to compete in relay races from 1953-1957. He coached the West Savannah Cardinals Baseball team for several years. After graduating, he attended Savannah State College (University). While matriculating at Savannah State, he was drafted into the United States Army on September 15, 1961, and was honorably discharged on August 27, 1963. He returned to Savannah State to complete his Bachelors Degree in Social Studies. His first teaching career began at the

segregated Jasper County High School and later at Ridgeland High School where he served as the Social Studies Department head. He implemented the Black History Curriculum and was Jasper County School's "Teacher of the Year" three times and "District Wide Teacher of the Year" once. He retired in 1996 after many years of service. In 2014, he was inducted into the Woodville-Tompkins High School Hall of Fame. He was the owner and operator of N&E Cleaning Service.

He is preceded in death by his parents, one son: Benjamin Reese; two sisters: Virginia Frazier and Louise Frazier; brothers: Henry Frazier and Leroy Brown. He leaves to cherish his memories, devoted loving wife Rosa Howsia Brown; grand daughter: Tieria Drayton (Taiwan); one sister: Juanita Giles, Hartford, Connecticut; great granddaughters: Taniah and Tyonna Drayton; a host of nieces and nephews including Gladys and Nathaniel Redfield and Darryl Reese; sisters-in-law: Ernestine White, Elizabeth Sheppard, Florence Green and Rebecca Drayton; a special friend Reverend Jerry Wright (Betty); a Goddaughter: Samaj' Bright; his Church Family, Second Saint John Missionary Baptist Church.
